State funeral of former Canadian Prime Minister Brian Mulroney

On March 23, Parliamentary Vice-Minister for Foreign Affairs Yasushi Hosoka attended as special envoy of Prime Minister Fumio Kishida the state funeral of former Canadian Prime Minister Brian Mulroney held in Montreal. He addressed, on behalf of the Government and people of Japan, his condolences to Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance Chrystia Freeland, and Minister of Foreign Affairs Melanie Joly. During his term in office, Mulroney signed the Redress Agreement, offering official apologies and compensation for World War II human rights abuse against Japanese Canadians. Considering the former Prime Minister's efforts to restore the honour of Japanese Canadians, Special Envoy Hosoka seized the opportunity his visit to Canada offered him to exchange views with members of the local Japanese Canadian community.



National Day Reception on the Occasion of His Majesty the Emperor's Anniversary

On March 22, I hosted for the first time since beginning my mandate in Montreal the National Day Reception on the Occasion of His Majesty the Emperor's Anniversary. The event proved a great success, gathering many guests, including dignitaries from the Parliament of Canada, the Province of Quebec, and the City of Montreal. There I met with Quebec Lieutenant Governor Manon Jeannotte, National Assembly President Nathalie Roy, French Language Minister Jean-François Roberge, International Relations and La Francophonie Minister Martine Biron, and Minister Responsible for Seniors and Minister for Health Sonia Bédaride. Through frank in-person exchanges of ideas and opinions regarding future Japan-Quebec relations, I developed a better understanding of Quebec's policy issues and priorities. Part of the G7, Japan and Canada – and Quebec – share values such as democracy and the respect of human rights, and face similar challenges including the aging of their population and labor shortages. I believe there lies great potential for cooperation and have thus reiterated my desire to explore said potential to its fullest with the aim of strengthening bilateral relations.

I also had the opportunity, as I attended an important budget debate from the public gallery, to address and greet the members of the National Assembly, whose Parliament Building combines tradition and innovation. At the beginning of the session, National Assembly President Roy, Prime Minister François Legault, Minister Biron, and other attendees smiled broadly as they congratulated me on recently taking up office.
