【カナダ全般】

(26日)トルドー首相は定例記者会見を行ったところ、同要旨は以下のとおり。

- ●<u>緊急支援計画が議会を通過。緊急補助金制度(PCU)は,困難に陥っているカナダ人に対して月額</u> 2000加ドルを4ヶ月に渡って支給する。
- ●新型コロナウイルスに関連するフィッシングサイト(詐欺)を確認している。注意願いたい。
- ●エア・トランザット社はグアテマラとエルサルバドルに航空機を派遣し、カナダ人の帰還支援を行う。
- ●G20 諸国と今朝会談を行った。各国は、検査数の増加と必要物資の十分な確保に向けて引き続き取り組んでいくことで合意。各国企業は必要物資の生産を目的にサプライチェーンを適宜適切化することが奨励。各国は世界経済の保護に向けて協力していくことで合意。
- ●昨晩からカナダに入国する全ての者に14日間の自主隔離を義務づけた。罰則規定もある。
- ●(記者の質問に対して、)米国国境の監視のために軍の出動をすることは考えていない。

【ケベック州】

(26日)13時、ルゴー州首相は定例記者会見を行ったところ、同要旨は以下のとおり。

- ●死者が2名増え、ケベック州では累計8名。陽性者は1629名(前日比290名増)、入院者は106名 (前日比28名増、その内43名が集中治療者(前日比8名増))。なお、ケベック州は世界においても10 万人当たりの検査数が最も多い地域であることを付言する。
- ●マスクが今後不足していく可能性がある。使用は真に必要なときに限るように要請する。
- ●昨日、トルドー首相が発表したとおり、現下の状況により職を失った者や財政難に陥っている者などに対して、月額2000加ドルが4月6日から支給される。他方、それまでにも困難に陥る者がいる。これを受け、ケベック州政府は、州内に存在する約30のフードバンクに資金供与することで困難に直面する州民の食料安全保障を確保。
- ●フードバンクに限らず、メンタルヘルスや高齢者・障害者支援団体などのコミュニティ団体の重要性は日毎に増しているが、ボランティア不足に陥っている。かかる状況を受け、ケベック州政府は、コミュニティ団体が登録でき、また、ボランティア活動を希望する州民が志願できるポータルサイトを設置(https://www.jebenevole.ca/_)。70歳以下であり、健康なケベック州民で余裕がある者は是非協力願いたい。既に多くのボランティアが活動しており、深く感謝する。もっとも、コミュニティ団体は十分に対人距離確保や頻繁な手洗いなどの指示を遵守してもらいたい。

【ニューブランズウィック州】

(26日)現地14時半、ヒッグス州首相が記者会見を実施したところ、同要旨は以下のとおり。

● Dr. Jennifer Russell, Chief Medical Officer of Health

- A) 7 new cases confirmed (all travel-related); total of 33 confirmed cases. Over 2,000 tests done
- B) Current measures are not expected to stay in place indefinitely or even until a vaccine is found, but at least until the curve is flattened and the spread has slowed down considerably. Should community transmission be identified in NB in the future, the testing strategy will change accordingly.
- C) Help and support lines and services are available, for adults and kids (https://www2.gnb.ca/content/gnb/en/departments/ocmoh/cdc/content/respiratory_disea ses/coronavirus/mental-health-and-coping-during-covid-19.html)
- D) Red Cross is accepting monetary donations and offers of volunteering; do not hesitate to reach out to them.
- E) New PEI case: the individual went through Moncton airport on March 18 from Air Transat flight TS2553 from Punta Cana.

NB Premier Blaine Higgs

- A) NB is introducing amendments to provide job protection for workers who must take a leave of absence (family care, sickness, etc.) due to the pandemic providing an unpaid leave for up to 15 weeks.
- B) WorkSafe NB will defer collection of assessment premiums for three months
- C) NB Government will be providing 15 million dollars to support small, medium and large employers in the short-term until the federal government aid comes in
- D) Small businesses operators like restaurants or seasonal businesses are eligible for loans up to \$200,000 and will not be required to pay principal on their loans for up to twelve months
- E) Follow-ups were done on the 43 non-complying businesses and all were found to now be in compliance.
- F) NB entry checkpoints screening system and procedures will continue to be expended and improved and delays will decrease in the coming days

【ノバスコシア州】

(26日)現地15時、マクニール州首相は記者会見を行ったところ、同要旨は以下のとおり。

●新たな5例のうち1例は国外旅行、先の感染例との関連が見つからず、市中感染とも今のところ断定できないが、セント・パトリック・デーを祝う約50人の集会に関連している可能性がある。この1例は対人距離確保がどれほど重要かを表しており、州政府勧告を守るよう再度要請する。

- ●Halifax Transit 従業員1人の感染例はバスの中で起きたことではなく、適切な衛生的措置を実施済みである。
- ●NS 州含め大西洋全州で越境制限をしているが、IWK Health Centre は引き続き大西洋州の患者の受け入れを行うので、PEI.NB.NL 州の人は安心してほしい。

【プリンスエドワードアイランド州】

- (1)(26日)現地17時, 州主任保健局長が記者会見を行ったところ, 同要旨は以下のとおり。
- A) <u>4 new cases in PEI</u>: men between ages of 55-70 years old, returned from international travel (2 from Europe, 1 from U.S., 1 from Caribbean). They all self-isolated upon return from travel to PEI.
- B) 2 of the new cases are in Queen's County, the other 2 new cases are in Prince County; the 4 cases are not connected. Contact tracing has been initiated. All 4 are at home with mild symptoms so far. All 4 came back about a week ago; developed symptoms several days after their return to PEI.

(2)(26日)現地13時半、州主任保健局長が記者会見を行ったところ、同要旨は以下のとおり。

- A) Still only 5 cases in PEI, with the first case initially announced having recovered and being out of self-isolation (while still social-distancing). The remaining 4 cases are at home selfisolating with mild symptoms.
- B) The 2 cases announced yesterday came to PEI via NB and Halifax respectively, each by private vehicle. The amount of details in information shared about cases will shift; only specify whether they are one of 3 types: 1) International travel, 2) Interprovincial travel, or 3) Community spread, because PEI is a small and tight community, to respect privacy of individuals. Flight information of cases will still be posted online, per national coordination.
- C) <u>Yesterday, authorities started following up on complaints about persons violating self-isolation order</u>. If there are concerns, please contact authorities via the 1-800 line (do not use 911).
- D) The essential services list has been updated to be consistent with other lists across the country. A decision regarding school closures is expected by the end of this week based on epidemiology.

- E) The initial closure of Government-owned liquor stores was discussed because it was felt the media may have misrepresented the facts. This was a temporary measure made to give the stores time to put safety and sanitizing measures in place for staff and for the public; there was never any intention to cut off access to alcohol as agency stores and breweries remained open during that time.
- F) The importance of staying at home, self-isolating, and social distancing when going out for essentials or fresh air was repeated. Health PEI's Marion Dowling said that when calling for assistance, it is important to inform Health PEI of any ongoing self-isolation situation and travel history to protect healthcare staff and others.
- G) The NESS mini-clinic mentioned yesterday is in the process of being set up, should be ready in the next day or so. It will have a "Cough and Fever" clinic for Islanders. Information on clinic location and access will be available tomorrow. Telephones and emails are being set up before the announcement. NESS mini-clinic will enable PEI to do more tests, see more people with symptoms, and keep them out of ER.
- H) The Charlottetown testing clinic is being moved to a drive-thru option.
- I) Approximately 100 retirees have been relicensed (physiotherapists, nurses, support staff, physicians, etc.) They will be paid via the casual workforce agreement.
- J) There was a question requesting an update for shared-custody/co-parenting families; PEI is also consulting counterparts in Family Law and will make consistent advice (which will have to be adjusted case per case) available online eventually.
- K) Pregnancy, prenatal care, and post-natal care was very broadly discussed. Health PEI's

 Marion Dowling mentioned obstetric groups have centralized their clinic support to be more

 flexible with the types of care they can offer during the pandemic, and that there is

 guidance in place which depends on the family's particular situation. It was stated that
 nationwide, the percentage of cases in ICU is currently at 2.6%

【ニューファンドランド・ラブラドール州】

(26日)現地15時、ボール州首相が記者会見を行ったところ、同要旨は以下のとおり。

- A) The province's chief medical officer of health said at the today's briefing on that all new cases are within the Eastern Health region, said Newfoundland and Labrador has 15 new cases of COVID-19 since Wednesday, <u>bringing the province's total to 82</u>. All new cases are within the Eastern Health region
- B) The Eastern Health region has 76 cases, 2 cases are in Central Health, 1 case is in Western Health, and 3 are in Labrador-Grenfell Health. Everyone is recovering at home.
- C) Health Minister provided further detail on health-care workers who have been affected by

the virus. He said 60 people at Eastern Health, in a variety of occupation are currently at home in isolation. Nine of them have tested positive. The health minister said most of those cases are connected to a funeral at Caul's Funeral Home in St. John's.
