

連邦政府・管轄州政府による発表（5月12日付）

【1 カナダ全般】

（12日）11時15分、トルドー首相が定例記者会見を行ったところ、同要旨は以下のとおり。

- 高齢者に対する支援として、計25億加ドルの支援策を表明。
- 長期介護施設など高齢者をめぐる状況改善のために今後各州と連携を高めていく。

【2 ケベック州】

（12日）13時、ルゴー州首相他が記者会見を行ったところ、同要旨は以下のとおり。

- 本日発表された死亡者118人のうち113人がモントリオール圏からのものであり、引き続き同圏が問題。
- 2メートルの社会的距離が遵守できない場合はマスクを着用して欲しい。N95でなく手製でも構わない。
- 20年前に自分（首相）が訪日した際、他人への配慮から人々はマスクを着用していた。日本の人々は風邪やインフルエンザに罹るとマスクを着用していたことを今思い出している。
- （どうして地下鉄でのマスク着用等を義務化しないのか問われ、）マスクが入手できるか分からないし、法令上の制約もある。義務化せずともマスクを着用するよう期待している。
- （小学校等でのマスク着用について問われアルダ州保健局長）完全に排除しないが、必ずしも絶対必要とは言えない。しかし、2歳以下の幼児には着用を勧めない。
- ラヴァルやモンテレジ等のホットスポット地域の人々は症状がなくとも検査に行きたくて欲しい。
- （バカンスシーズンの移動について問われ、）地域間での移動は制限しなければならない。蔓延の抑制を念頭に可能なことを今後検討したい。
- （ケベック州の失業率がオンタリオ州より悪くなったことについて問われ、）これはケベックが活動を休止したことによる。オンタリオ州では殆どの製造業施設の稼働を維持していた。（ケベック州失業率17%、オンタリオ州失業率11%）
- 今週の14日木曜と15日金曜にモントリオールへ状況視察に行く。

【3 ノバスコシア州】（※定例記者会見は火・水・金のみ開催される模様。）

（1）（12日）州政府関係者による記者会見の要旨は以下のとおり。

- **Chief Medical Officer of Health Dr. Robert Strang**
 - A) 1 new case for a total of 1020 (48 deaths). He acknowledged the good news that the past few days showed low numbers, but cautioned everyone not to ease up on public health measures after only a few days' data, several days of consistent data are needed before expecting easing up to begin.
 - B) He commented on active cases provincially vs active cases in long-term care: in the last 24 hours, public health has updated data, moving a lot of cases from Active to Recovered, using their central data. But long-term care data comes from a different data source and

arrives on a different timeline, so that same work is still pending for long-term data. They are working to increase consistency between both of these data sets.

- C) As regards students picking up their belongings from school buildings, he confirmed that the school year will end June 5 and that all learning remains virtual until then. Starting May 25, a single student or one family member of that student will have access to the school building by appointment only to ensure respect of public health measures and pick up materials/belongings. Schools will be in touch with students and families to explain how to make appointments.
- D) When asked what trend was necessary for presenting a plan to ease up measures, he gave the following note: A trend of little to no cases for a minimum of 2 weeks (28 days ideally, two incubation periods). There are other issues to consider, but this is the minimum.
- E) When asked about the eventual first phase of the plan and defining non-urgent healthcare services, he noted outpatient surgeries and dental care (also possibly physiotherapy) would be looked at initially, and he acknowledged the gains made in virtual care in the interim.

- **NS Premier Stephen McNeil**

During Q&A, he said that before considering interprovincial travel (with NB and PE as specific examples), he wants NS to focus on its partners within the province (e.g. restaurants, cosmetologists, dental offices) and ensure the rules are clear within NS. He also highlighted that the measures that will be eased back first will likely be community-centric to avoid high-case area residents going to low-case areas for services.

(2)(12日) As of today, May 12, Nova Scotia has 1,020 confirmed cases of COVID-19. One new case was identified Monday, May 11.

There are three licensed long-term care homes and unlicensed seniors' facilities in Nova Scotia with active cases of COVID-19. Northwood in Halifax currently has 157 residents and eight staff with active cases. One other facility has one staff member with an active case of COVID-19 and another facility has one resident with an active case.
