

連邦政府・管轄州政府による発表（6月26日付）

【ノバスコシア州】

（26日）さらなる再開措置に関し、州政府による記者会見の要旨以下のとおり。

- Restaurants and licensed liquor establishments can operate at 100% capacity (respecting established spaced-out seating) and can serve patrons until midnight.
- Private campgrounds can operate at 100% capacity. Public pools, beaches, playgrounds can reopen.
- Individuals in homes funded by the Disability Support Program can now resume going out into their communities.

All must continue to observe Public Health protocols and regulations, and sector plans.

- The Atlantic bubble will be in place effective July 3.
- With the reopening of the province and easing of restrictions, Public Health now recommends that all Nova Scotians who are in a situation where they are out and around people outside of their family and physical distancing cannot be maintained should be wearing a non-medical mask (public transit, gatherings, grocery stores and retail stores, etc.). Only exceptions are children under 2 and people with specific conditions preventing them from wearing a mask.
- Due to the concerning COVID-19 situation in the U.S., the 2020 Yarmouth Ferry service (Bar Harbor, Maine, US to Yarmouth, Nova Scotia) is cancelled.
