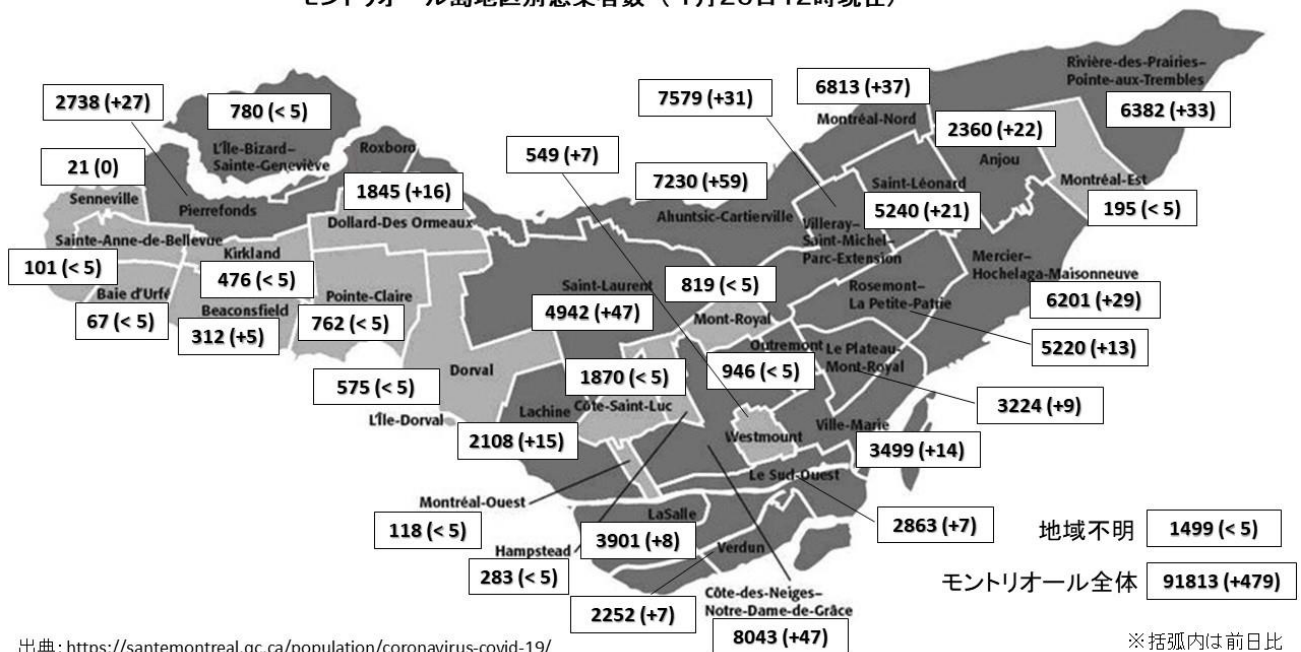

Nova Scotia discovers grassroots success with COVID-19 rapid-test kits

Downtown Halifax's restaurants and bars have become home to volunteers offering rapid [COVID-19](#) tests so patrons can socialize with some assurance they are free of the virus, an experiment that is giving a window into what a new normal could look like.

While health authorities across the country have been slow to utilize the millions of rapid test kits acquired by the federal government, the Nova Scotia experiment is demonstrating a grassroots-powered public-health program that is uncomplicated and nimble. Those doing the tests are recruited from the general public, and they become ambassadors for testing as a way to help live with the pandemic.

MP pushing Higgs government to deploy thousands of unused rapid tests

A New Brunswick MP says he is pushing the Higgs government to deploy thousands of unused COVID-19 rapid tests. But Saint John-Rothesay MP Wayne Long is getting pushback for doing so, with a provincial cabinet minister telling him to leave it up to health professionals.

New Brunswick has used less than one per cent of its available rapid tests sent to the province by the federal government. That's as neighbouring Nova Scotia has begun deploying the tests in pop-up clinics open to anyone who is over the age of 16, without symptoms.

Neighbouring Nova Scotia has been quick to use the tests as part of its approach, having offered nearly 20 days of rapid-testing opportunities already this year. It has used 15,000 rapid tests to date.

Vaccine goals still on track despite Pfizer-BioNTech shipment delays, health minister says

New Brunswick's health minister says she believes the province can stay on track with its vaccination goals for the first quarter of 2021 despite a disruption in the supply of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine starting this week.

Dorothy Shephard says she's hopeful the federal government is right when it says Pfizer will "ramp up" shipments of its COVID-19 vaccine in March so that supplies catch up and provinces can still hit their targets. But in the meantime the province will have to adjust its roll-out plans for February to deal with the reduction in shipments, which includes no new Pfizer vaccine for Canada this week.

As of Monday, New Brunswick had received 21,675 vaccine doses, including a shipment of 3,900 doses from Pfizer last Friday.

Charges laid after Moncton anti-mask rally

Charges have been laid against several people at an anti-mask protest held in Moncton on Sunday.

Codiac Regional RCMP arrested at least five people who appeared in Moncton provincial court Monday by phone from police holding cells.

The arrests followed Codiac Regional RCMP telling Moncton council last week that officers would take action regarding anti-mask protesters flouting provincial rules meant to limit the spread of COVID-19.
