New restrictions

Fitzgerald also announced new restrictions in place as part of the increase in cases.

Effective immediately, anyone who is fully vaccinated and deemed a close contact of a positive case will need to isolate for seven days. Fitzgerald acknowledged the change is extreme, but called it a necessary measure to limit spread of the virus.

Travel around the province for sporting events, recreation and arts events is prohibited. Teams can continue to play within their own region.

Weddings, funerals, burials and religious events will be limited to 50 per cent capacity in areas where the NL vax pass is accepted, and 25 per cent capacity in places without the need for the pass.

Fitness spaces, cinemas, arenas, and performance spaces are reduced to 50 per cent capacity. Restaurants can operate at 75 per cent capacity with physical distancing in place.

There are no changes to in-home gatherings with the upcoming holiday season, but Fitzgerald encouraged people to keep contacts low and work from home where possible.

31 new cases of COVID-19 announced on P.E.I. Friday

New restrictions

Morrison announced further public restrictions starting at 8 a.m. Saturday morning and continuing until at least Jan. 8.

These include a reduction in **personal gatherings to 10 people plus household members.** Those 10 people should be a "steady 10" not different people, she said.

Visitation for long-term case homes on P.E.I. has been adjusted and will be limited to three Partners in Care and three designated visitors who will be continue to be screened.

Physical distancing in public spaces will be a legal requirement rather than a suggestion, Morrison said, and signage should be posted. Capacity in public spaces such as retailers will be reduced to 50 per cent. Morrison asked employers to help staff work from home wherever possible.

She asked all Islanders to reduce their personal contacts by 50 per cent.

The interim measures, in addition to the current Level 1 measures, include:

- People must limit their household contacts to a maximum of a Steady 20.
- Distancing must be maintained at all times in businesses, retail establishments, gyms, salons and spas. Dining in restaurants is still permitted but two metres must be maintained between tables and proof of vaccination is still required.
- Entertainment centres, including movie theatres, professional sporting venues, casinos, etc., will be operating at 50 per cent capacity with distancing of two metres.

...An additional 16 cases have been confirmed as the Omicron variant, bringing the total number of confirmed cases of that variant to 30. Identified samples will continue to be tested to determine their COVID-19 variant.
