**COVID-19 : le ministre Christian Dubé annonce une série de nouvelles restrictions**

Aux prises avec une flambée majeure de COVID-19 à quelques jours des Fêtes, le gouvernement du Québec ordonne la fermeture des écoles primaires et secondaires. Les bars, casinos, gyms, cinéma et salles de spectacle ainsi que les spas devront fermer dès 17 h ce soir. Les restaurants pourront de leur côté continuer d'opérer pendant les Fêtes, mais seulement entre 5 h et 22 h tous les jours. Dès demain, toutes les écoles primaires et secondaires seront fermées et toutes les activités parascolaires sont suspendues jusqu'à nouvel ordre. Les cours en présentiel ne pourront reprendre que le 10 janvier prochain. Les services de garde, quant à eux, demeureront ouverts avant Noël, en priorité pour les travailleurs essentiels. Les prestations sportives en salle devront quant à elles se faire à huis clos. Les milieux d'enseignement supérieur, soit les cégeps et les universités, pourront rester ouverts si les étudiants ont des examens ou des stages. « Le télétravail est maintenant obligatoire », a aussi confirmé M. Dubé.

**2 Atlantic provinces commit to open borders, but 1 tightens up amid COVID-19 wave**

N.S., N.B. and P.E.I. are allowing interprovincial travel, but N.L. is bringing in restrictions

Two Atlantic premiers say they don't see the need to tighten border measures as COVID-19 cases rise across the region and country, but a third province is taking that step.

Both Tim Houston of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick's Blaine Higgs told CBC News this weekend that closing interprovincial and national borders isn't a good move.

#### ニューファンドランド・ラブラドル州

They said most premiers across the country agreed with that point during a call this week with Prime Minister Justin Trudeau about curbing the spread of the Omicron variant....But on Sunday, **Newfoundland and Labrador** [announced new restrictions for travellers](#) at a press conference with Chief Medical Officer of Health Dr. Janice Fitzgerald and Premier Andrew Furey.

The province announced 61 new cases since Friday. There are nine confirmed cases of Omicron and 34 presumptive cases.

(December 19, 2021) Effective midnight tonight, the communities of Badger, Gander, Grand Falls-Windsor and Twillingate will be moving into Alert Level 3.

Effective Monday, December 20 at 12:01 a.m., the remainder of the province will move to Alert Level 2.

Effective 3:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 21, **all fully vaccinated travellers will need to isolate for five days upon arrival**. They will need to take a [rapid test](#) every day for five days and, if they are all negative, they can leave isolation after five full days or 120 hours have passed. The Department of Education, in consultation with Public Health, has advised the Newfoundland and Labrador English School District and the Francophone School District to suspend in-person classes for students two days early. The final day of classes will be Monday, December 20, 2021, and classes will resume on January 4, 2022... While no decision has been made at this time on a shift to online learning, classes will resume on January 4 regardless of format.
